Sport Funding Report

School Overview

At Nanaksar Primary School, we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of our pupils. We believe that an innovative, varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all our pupils.

What is Primary School Sport Funding? (PSSF)

The Government is providing funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013/14, 2014/15 and 2015/16 to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport and will see money going directly to primary school Headteachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

Our Primary School Sport's Funding will enable us to continue and extend our provision through employing additional sports professionals, building upon on resources and equipment and training our staff to deliver in-house quality PE sessions.

Purpose of the funding

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses of the funding could include hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE, running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games.

| New equipment to support the KS1 Curriculum and to cater for Sport's Day and the unit on athletics (javelin, hurdles, skipping ropes, etc.) | £897.00 | The expenditure has enabled existing equipment to be topped up and has resulted in brand new resources being ordered and used in weekly PE lessons, to provide pupils with opportunities to access a broader range of activities and games. |
| New outdoor playground equipment for lunch times and to encourage an 'active playtime' | £279.00 | The new lunch time equipment has encouraged a more active play time, through the use of soft equipment including foam balls, hoops, tennis sets, etc. |

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| PSD CPD: Team teaching with staff to deliver high quality PE lessons in the Summer term | 6 weeks @ £170 £1020 x 2 days £2040.00 | Staff feel supported in their delivery of PE lessons and CPD sessions provide them with key teaching strategies to up-skill pupils within PE lessons. |
| A-Life Workshops: Health & Fun Fitness Workshops | £240.00 | Delivered by PE Sports Development Department at Hillingdon for all our pupils. The sessions consisted of active play jungle trails, Olympic activities and short games, combining fitness with numeracy and healthy living facts in a very active and fun exercise session. |
| PSD Expertise: Queen's Birthday Celebrations (17.06.16) | £170.00 | Experienced PSD Coach delivers Royal themed physical games and activities to encourage team spirit and exercise |
| PSD Expertise: Sport's Day support. Leading skills based activities on the day (5.07.16) | £170.00 | Experienced PSD Coach supports activities for the annual Sport's Day, focusing on specific skills across the Athletics unit. |
| PE Rewards | £77.00 | Medals to reward pupils at the end of the year for their sporting activity and motivate them to continue physical exercise at home as well as school. |

- In addition to this, pupils have the opportunity to take part in after-school football coaching sessions twice a week for Year 1 & 2 (paid for by parents).
- Playground markings for the new play area are being explored, to promote active playtimes.
- A pupils enter KS2 in September, funding will also be used to explore a broader range of sports including cricket and cycling.
- Nanaksar Primary School did not receive any funding in 2013-2014 due to pupils not being old enough for the funding category.
- In 2014-2015, the school received £8,502 for Sports Funding. Planned expenditure included coaching expertise from Primary Sporting Development (PSD), who developed skills amongst teachers and pupils over a 6 week period and the purchase of brand new resources to support the teaching of the PE curriculum across the year groups.
